



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How to secure a work experience placement?

- Discuss with a family/friend member what is possible
- Nominate a family member or friend who can take your son/daughter
- Specific profession of interest if you have contacts then do try to secure a related placement if possible.
- You will need to be flexible their age will restrict what is possible now
- Employer must have Employer & Public Liability Insurance







What is Unifrog?



Unifrog is an online careers platform used by over half of the secondary schools and colleges in the UK. The platform has various tools to help students research careers and future pathways, draft CVs and personal statements, and manage work experience.

The school will start to use the platform this year. Every student will receive their own log in.

Unifrog's Placements tool helps schools, students, parents and employers with the admin behind work experience.

More than 1000 schools use this tool to organise work experience, and 90,000+ placements have been processed through the tool.

Students

Log into Unifrog via a welcome email in school once logins are ready.

Source a placement **FIRST**, then log the information on Unifrog.



Parents/Carers

Support your child to source a placement. Encourage them to log it on Unifrog.

Look out for an email from Unifrog once the student and the employer have completed their forms.
